#### Pastor's Pen.....


With Ash Wednesday on March 5<sup>th,</sup> we will officially begin the annual six weeks of Lent. Some churches observe it, and some don't. Some get heavily into it with Wednesday worship services, while others give it more of a passing nod. Some churches are even adamantly opposed to it since Lent is not mentioned anywhere in the Bible. I've even heard that argument leveled before: "If Lent is not in the Bible, then we shouldn't do it!"

It's true that "Lent" is not mentioned in the Bible, per se......but then neither is Jesus' birth in Bethlehem called "Christmas" and thereby decreed to be an annual festival. Yes, his birth is recorded in scripture, but not as the holiday that it's blossomed into. Further, the breathless announcement by Mary Magdalene "I have seen the Lord!" (John 20:18) is not some sort of pronouncement that the church shall have a blend of a special worship service and pancake breakfast each year. We do a lot of things that aren't necessarily spelled out in the text of scripture.

So, why do we do them? Because they help us to make sense of the Christian faith in ways that we can understand, and also because they highlight what God has done. Further, we also do them because it isn't a wrong thing to take some joy in how God interacts with the created order. Maybe they are human constructed dramas, but human beings actually need for some things to be visible and tangible. They help us to grasp truisms that would seem a lot more abstract, otherwise.

Lent commemorates the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness where he fasted, and prayed, and was tempted by the devil. And it begins this month. See you Sunday!

Pastor David's procedure in visiting St. Paul's shut-ins, as well as, those members who have a difficult time getting to church is to offer support, bring Holy Communion (their option) and to let them know we journey together in worship. Pastor David understands that scheduling may depend on frequency of doctor's appointments or the church member's schedule. Visitation is always available, however, as the shut-in member's health and life situation may change and more extensive pastoral care is needed. Do you take medicines and wonder if there's anything that can be done other than just recycling the pill bottles? If you're like me, you already have pill bottles filled with different size nails and screws or other little things.

Well, I've found a ministry, Matthew 25 Ministries\*\*, just outside of Cincinnati, in Blue Ash, Ohio, that accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies for their ministries. Their pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

Beginning immediately, I'll be collecting empty pill bottles to take to Matthew 25 Ministries on my next trip to Cincinnati later this spring. There are some requirements that need to be followed for the bottles to be accepted by M25M.

### They accept the following types of bottles:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill Bottles with and without secure caps (child-resistant)

#### Pill bottle donations should adhere to the following guidelines:

- Bottles must have an all plastic lid.
- All labels should be removed, leaving no glue or residue.
- All bottles and lids should be washed with dish soap, rinsed, and dried.
- Caps should be placed back onto the clean, dried bottles.




