Pastoral visitation is available to those who are hospitalized, temporarily laid up at home, or going through rehab at a facility. Because hospitals and other institutions do not notify the church when a patient is admitted, we need for you or your family member to notify us. We will be more than happy to accommodate your request for pastoral care. Please note also that the pastor may be reached for emergencies at (224) 386-6285 (cell phone).

Pastor David's procedure in visiting St. Paul's shut-ins, as well as, those members who have a difficult time getting to church is to offer support, bring Holy Communion (their option) and to let them know we journey together in worship. Pastor David understands that scheduling may depend on frequency of doctor's appointments or the church member's schedule. Visitation is always available, however, as the shut-in member's health and life situation may change and more extensive pastoral care is needed. Any church member or their family member desiring more frequent pastoral visitation, or to be placed on the visitation list in the first place should contact the church office at (847)-358-0399 to make arrangements.



My dad shaved his head for me

A little over a year ago Will Checketts, then seven years old, was playing with his younger brother when he hit his head. His dad, <u>Nate Checketts</u>, took him to the hospital to get checked out, just to be safe. But a CT scan found that what had appeared to be just a goose-egg was in fact a serious head injury; Will had suffered a skull fracture and his brain was bleeding. The doctors said the boy had mere hours to live unless he got emergency brain surgery.

Will understood that the surgery was necessary but he was understandably terrified, and he was especially concerned about having to get his head shaved. Nate assured his son that it would be OK and to prove it, he shaved his head, too.

"Seeing my dad's bald head made me laugh and also feel a lot better about my head," says Will, who is now eight years old and fully recovered. "Now my dad's teaching me

Paul: On October 30th 2024 Shelter Inc announced the groundbreaking of a home for children who have survived human trafficking. This home will have 12 rooms for girls ages 12-18 and they are hoping to have it open late summer or early fall.

This was made know to us through Palatine Faith in Action which Melissa Gumm attends for us. It was then shared at TPIRC, Spiritual Life and Community Outreach, where we came up with the idea to make fleece tie blankets for the girls coming in. Fabric has been purchased through the Wachs Fund and we are ready to begin!

What will be required is to cut the corners using a template already prepared, cut short strips along all sides of the blanket and tie these strips to secure the front panel to the back panel of fabrics.

The cutting and tying may be done while sitting. If you have fabric scissors to cut, please bring yours. Otherwise we will have some scissors available.

There is no need to sign up. Please feel free to bring a friend as well.




